Cleveland Moving Companies - Creating A Moving Checklist

Any kind of move is chaotic. There's a lot to take care of, so much work to do and plenty of packing to do. Whether it's an office move or an apartment move or a big home relocation, things can be much easier with the assistance of a moving checklist.

Here are a few tips for making a moving checklist, which is invaluable to you in a move.

1. Decide who'll actually be doing the moving of your things. You have the choice of hiring a moving company or doing the manual labor on your own. In such a case, you have to figure out the costs of hiring a moving truck and compare this with the moving services' rates. Nevertheless, factor in the value of your time and energy when you calculate your self-moving costs. You might find it's far more advantageous to hire a professional moving company with a long-distance move.
2. Next, make a visit to your new home to list any repairs, painting or carpet cleaning or replacement work to be done before you move in. It is always better to alter the locks if you are moving into anything other than a brand-new home.
3. List out any record transfers and changes of addresses which have to be made with the post office, credit card companies, doctors, dentists, banks and magazine along with other subscriptions. Determine if your current bank is available in your new locale or if other arrangements must be made. If you're under the treatment of a physician, arranging for transfer of records along with your move guarantees your new doctor will have them when needed.
4. Sketch out a floor plan of your new home to make a checklist for each room, depicting the placement of your furniture. Incorporate a reminder for packing all the things you require first on reaching your new home in a single box, in order that they are easily accessible to you when you get to your new home.
5. Go through all the rooms in your current home and pack all of the items that go in a single room together. Don't forget to mark boxes based on the room its contents go to. Rather than carrying your clutter with you, do away with things you do not want through a garage or yard sale. Homeless shelters and other charities never turn away donated clothes.
6. List all of the utility services to be connected or disconnect before moving. It's better to plan your disconnection and re-connection so that you can utilize the services as soon as you move into your new home.
7. Place all important phone numbers in a single place. Make a back-up list and keep it elsewhere.
8. List important chores to be completed when you're settled, such as changing your address on your driver's license, passport, and other important official documents.
9. Confirm the moving dates with your moving truck rentals or moving companies.
